

CLASSROOM FOCUSES

<p>Room 1 Mrs Hatfull</p>	<p>Reading – we are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Relate picture to print • Look at pictures as clues to meaning • Control directionality left to right pointing with left fore finger. • Re-read to gain meaning • Point to each word at the beginning of each word • Handle books correctly • Recognise capital letters and fullstops • Know: picture, text, cover, letter, word first letter, last letter, top of page, bottom of page, story.
<p>Room 2 Miss Viles</p>	<p>We are learning to give a talk. We know we are successful when we can talk for about a minute on a topic we know lots about, with a big clear voice, using some expression.</p> <p>We are learning to tell the time. O'clock, ½ past, 5 minute intervals, ¼ past the hour, ¼ to the hour.</p>
<p>Room 3 Mrs Spencer</p>	<p>Writing – we are learning to write a speech. We will do this by: Introduction – gains audience attention. Organisation – flow of speech with main points developed. Conclusion – audience left with something to think about.</p> <p>Maths – Geometry We are learning to :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and describe 2D and 3D shapes • Follow and give instructions describing position and using quarter, half, three quarter turns clockwise and anticlockwise • Draw simple maps and plans • Give directions using compass directions, north, east, south and west.
<p>Room 6 Mr Johansen</p>	<p>Reading – We are learning to: Extract information from different texts. WALT: Make our speeches more interesting to listen to. Writing - WALT to finish a speech in a good way, by linking it to the beginning. WALT: Give feedback and help with proofreading.</p> <p>Maths - WALT: Find and solve different number patterns and create our own. (Round up from Probability - WALT find probability and do qualified guessing).</p>
<p>Room 7 Mr Smith</p>	<p><u>English:</u> Room Seven are learning to prepare, write, receive feedback, reshape and deliver to an audience a 3 minute speech. <u>Mathematics:</u> Room Seven are learning to understand and find the perimeter and area of shapes as part of our measurement unit.</p>
<p>Room 8 Mrs Dalley</p>	<p><u>English:</u> All students will present a three minute speech, which is well planned, interesting, appropriate and well-learned. Students will use good eye contact, clarity of speaking, variety in their expression, adequate volume and will know their topic thoroughly. <u>Mathematics:</u> Learning to find the area and circumference of circles, and the volume of cuboids and cylinders.</p>
