CLASSROOM FOCUSES

<p>Room 1 Mrs McIntyre</p>	<p>Maths: We are building our number knowledge range 0 - 20. We are counting forwards and backwards from any number and learning what comes before and after within this range.</p> <p>Writing: We are learning to hold our pen correctly while we write simple sentences that make sense. We are learning to use lots and lots of words from our word card and around the room.</p> <p>Inquiry: We are learning about how the properties of substances can change using the cold or heat - such as freezing water then melting it again.</p>
<p>Room 2 Mrs Hatfull</p>	<p>We are learning to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read with fluency and expression (like talking) • Read using the punctuation to help make the reading sound phrased and fluent. • At difficulty, look at the picture, look at the bits of the word I know, think about the story. Try to solve the word. • Reread to check. <p>Read easy books for pleasure.</p>
<p>Room 3 Mrs Spencer</p>	<p>Maths : Addition and Subtraction We are learning to: # solve + and - problems by counting on and back in our heads in ones and tens # using tidy numbers (29 + 18 as 30 + 17) # place value (33 + 16 as 30+10+3+6)</p> <p>Writing: Poetic Writing We are learning to write poems about autumn using our senses.</p>
<p>Room 5 Ms Cavey</p>	<p>Maths - We are learning to identify all numbers 1-1000 and 1-1000 000. English – we are learning to edit our daily recounts focusing on surface features, such as punctuation, (full stops, commas, capitals and direct speech) and self correcting spelling of essential words.</p>
<p>Room 6 Miss Gray</p>	<p>We are learning to create different graphs (pictographs, stem and leaf and bar graphs so far)</p> <p>We will know we have been successful when our graphs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -have a title -have the axis labelled -all data is present -have a key (if needed) -clearly and correctly show the right information -have a scale (if needed)
<p>Room 7 Mr Smith</p>	<p>Written English: Room Seven are learning to use appropriate language when writing procedures. They will do this by writing a variety of procedures.</p> <p>Mathematics: Room Seven are learning to increase their basic knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages.</p>
<p>Room 8 Mrs Dalley</p>	<p>Mathematics: Our focus here is understanding that a variable (e.g. x) is just a symbol that can represent different values in an expression, e.g. $10x + 3x = 52$, therefore $x = 4$. A great website to help understand algebra is Khan Academy Algebra with some really interesting videos!</p> <p>English: Our focus is to improve our work presentation with better quality handwriting and publishing of text on devices.</p>
