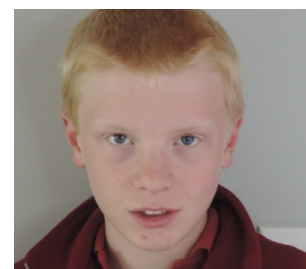

CLASSROOM FOCUSES

Room 1 Mrs Hatfull / Mrs Parkes	Room One We are learning to be writers Group 1 WALT (We are learning to) To draw a picture and make a some writing attempts copying letters from word card. Writing over teacher written text. Write high frequency words from word card. Start by the margin and go the right way, use 2 finger gaps and a full stop at the end Writing on the line. Group 2 WALT Write some of the sound heard in a spelling attempt; try to use a capital letter and a full stop. 2 finger spaces Group 3 WALT Use capital letters and full stops. Record all the sounds in a spelling attempt, Write a question a feeling or an idea Join a sentence using and, but, for because. Use interesting describing words Use different sentence starters.
Room 2 Miss Viles	WALT: be careful and comprehensive readers -by inferring to help us understand what we read and reflect on the information we read. -summarise in our own words the stories we read and talk about the main/minor characters - know the difference between fact and fiction In inquiry 'What goes Round' we have been learning about the sun and moon and the effect they have on Earth
Room 3 Mrs Spencer	Writing – we are learning to write a narrative that has a main character and a story line that has a problem and a solution. Visual Arts – we are learning to plan a piece of art by thinking carefully about a topic, the style, (paper mache) and the finished product.
Room 6 Mr Johansen	Writing: WALT write a good speech using a rich vocabulary and using an outline as base. Math: WALT understand and use correct terms about probability and chance. WALT to use data to extract information.
Room 7 Mr Smith	Mathematics: Room Seven are learning to understand units of measurement and how to convert them from one to the other. Eg 1000mm = 1metre, 1000mls = 1litre. (multiply or divide by 1000). Reading: Room Seven are learning to read more fluently. They will do this by reading short stories and poem to an audience.
Room 8 Mrs Dalley	Mathematics- We are working on converting fractions and percentages to decimals. English - We are learning to link ideas between paragraphs with key words. Theme - We are improving our research and planning skills to develop a biology presentation.

Please note the following...

1. Grades A, D & C will play a straight round Robin. The top 2 teams at the end of the round robin will play off in the finals. A Goal advantage will be used in the A grade only, goal advantages are indicated beside your team names above. Goal Advantages **will not** be used in the finals.
2. B Grade will start by playing the games they missed in round 2. They will then be split into 2 sections for the tournament. The top teams at the end of section play will play off in the final.
3. Each team will need to provide their own umpire who will umpire their team's games.
4. All round robin games will be 8 minutes each way with a 1 minute half-time and 1 minute between games. Please make sure your teams have tossed and are ready to take the court immediately after the bell rings. Finals will be 10 minutes each way.
5. There will be no extra time added for injuries. Please have your replacement players ready to take the court immediately should they be required.
6. Points will be awarded as follows...
WIN = 3 DRAW = 2 LOSS of 3 or LESS = 1 LOSS of 4 or MORE = 0
7. In the event of a tie at the end of Section play the winner will be decided by Goal Ratio.
8. In the event of a tie in the final, play will continue until one team is ahead by 2 goals.
