All our teachers attended the Community of Learning Teacher Day on Friday, at James Cook School in Marton. Parent/Student/Teacher Learning Conferences

OH NO! Sincere apologies, but the dates for these have to change yet again! The course our four teachers are going to has been changed again by the organisers, not us!

Conferences will now be in the last week of the term, on:

Monday 2 July from 3.30 to 5.30pm

Tuesday 3 July from 1.30 to 7.30pm

Online, or phone bookings for fifteen minutes slots will be opened next week, with families with more than one child at school first up.

Some parents have expressed the wish to have a more traditional interview format with teachers, and if that is the case, please could you let the class teacher/s concerned know so that they can prepare themselves and your child appropriately.

Generally, all children will take part their learning conference, with input from the teacher, with the child and parents/whanau sharing the child's achievements and discussing future learning, etc.

If anyone has any concerns or wishes to talk with their child's teacher at any other time, please make contact with them directly, and they will make a time to have a chat.

Mid Year Reports - due out to you on Friday 29 June.

These reports give a snapshot of your child's achievement in reading, writing and maths. Teachers will be happy to expand on these reports and discuss your child's achievement and future learning needs at the learning conferences.

Classroom Learning Intentions:	
R1	Math – We are learning to: * make and count sets of objects pointing to each as we count * read and order numbers to 20 * skip count forwards and backwards in 2's, 5's and 10's
R2	We are learning to be: be confident with numbers up to 20, 100 and 1000. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Using a hundreds board count on or back to work out addition and subtraction questions. Use an algorithm without regrouping to solve addition problems/ count on in 10's to work out addition problems, e.g $39+20=$ Hot spot: know doubles and halves to 10 and then to 20, skip counting in 2's to 50 and 100
R3	We are learning to add and subtract using working form as a strategy $\begin{array}{r} 34 \\ +23 \\ \hline 57 \end{array}$ Once we understand this method and can identify ones, tens and hundreds we start to carry over tens and hundreds. We are working on our basic facts: - quick recall of addition and subtraction fact to 10, 20 and whole tens to 100 - multiplication of 2s, 5s, and 10s using skip counting. - division of 2s, 5s and 10s
R5	MATHS: ADDITION and SUBTRACTION: 1. We are learning to add and subtract, using vertical sums, 2, 3 and 4 digits numbers, with and without, regrouping. 2. We are learning to understand the meaning of sum and difference in one step word problems: 3. We will learn to associate the terms "sum" and "difference" with addition and subtraction respectively.
R6	*Name and list the properties of 2D and 3D shapes *Create 3D shapes from nets *Predict what shape nets will make *Reflect, rotate, translate and enlarge shapes *Correctly use the vocabulary of Geometry
R7	Apologies - Mr Smith is away today.
R8	- know and use the order of operations when questions have more than 1 operation e.g. $6 + 9 \times 6 - 21 = ?$ - use our knowledge of multiplication and division by 10/100/1000 to solve multiplication and division of decimals - solve simple addition and subtraction equations involving integers
VALUE OF THE WEEK: MANAAKITANGA ... QUALITY BEHAVIOUR - DO I USE GOOD MANNERS? Examples: Yes, please. No, thank you. Please may I? Walking around people talking, (not between them). Do I greet and say goodbye positively? Do I ask politely? Do I thank everyone properly? Do I apologise genuinely when I need to? Am I speaking in a good tone of voice?
