Tena koutou katoa – Greetings to all families and friends of Huntermville School.

Our interschool swimmers put in a huge effort and achieved excellent results at the Marton Cluster Schools competition on Thursday, and the Taihape Interschool event all day on Friday. A huge thank you to Paulette and Shane for their very efficient, effective organisation of these events, and to the most generous families and whanau for their transport and support.

We will share the actual results when they arrive from the event organisers, however, many of our swimmers won through to finals, and swam fast enough times to place in the top three, with many first placings. Classroom Learning Intentions:

Value of the Week - MANNERS - What are they? What will it sound like if people are using them? What will we see if people are using them? When should we use them? Who do we say them to?

Rm 1	We are learning to manage our reading learning at home - We will know we are successful when: We have read our Home Reader to someone (an adult or older person) We have practised the words in in our word tin We practised the words in our notebook. We have read the poems in the Poetry Book An adult has signed the Reading Log in the Journal cover If I have brought my Published Writing home, once a week, I share reading my stories to my family. I have practised my Friday Fast words for the competition held each Friday.
Rm 2	WALT: be confident with numbers up to 20 and 100 by: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• skip counting forward and back in 2, 5, and 10's• know how to order numbers from smallest to biggest up to 20 and 100• know our number bonds to 20• Add and subtract by creating number stories and using materials• be able to spell, write and say numbers up to 20 and 10
Rm 3	Maths – we are learning to apply place value knowledge to solve number problems using tens frames and place value blocks. Reading – we are learning to read and identify words that have short vowel sounds.
Rm 5	MATHS: ADDITION and SUBTRACTION: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. We are learning to add & subtract, using vertical sums, of 2, 3 & 4 digits, with & without regrouping.2. We are learning to understand the meaning of sum and difference in one step word problems:3. We will learn to associate the terms "sum" and "difference" with addition and subtraction
Rm 6	We are learning to subtract numbers which need regrouping -identify if the sum needs regrouping (cannot take smaller number from a bigger number) -split the smaller number in 2 tidy pieces -take the pieces off the first number. Eg - 71-14, split 14 into 10 and 4 - 71-10=61, take off the 4 left over =57. So 71-14=57
Rm 7	Room Seven are learning to read, write, identify the values and order numbers up to a million. Room Seven are learning the skills of running, jumping and throwing in preparation for athletics.
Rm 8	Reading – we are learning to use note taking to summarise Writing – we are learning to use descriptive language when introducing a setting or character. Inquiry – we are learning to use key words to find our open questions & use google slides to communicate.
