Room 1 Mrs McIntyre	We are learning to be good speakers and listeners good speakers look at their audience, speak clearly and tell the audience lots about the topic - good listeners look and listen to the speaker without interrupting, think about what the speaker is saying and can ask relevant questions We are learning to know our numbers to 20 particularly counting backwards and knowing what comes before and after a number.		
Room 2 Mrs Hatfull	 READING: We are learning to Consistently look at the meaning, the grammar and the shape of words (all the bits we know) when the word is hard. Know the names of punctuation marks and read it correctly. Read selectively for pleasure and information. Know 3 letter blends. I.e. thr, scr Build word patterns to get from known words to new. I.e. cat, catch, catastrophe. Talk confidently about the plot, characters and sequence of events. 		
Room 3 Mrs Spencer	Reading: We are learning to discuss what we read to improve comprehension. Writing: Deeper Features, Sentence Structure: We are learning to put our ideas, thoughts and feelings into sensible order. Maths: We are increasing our number knowledge by reading any number up to 1000, saying the number that is 1, 10, 100 more or less and ordering numbers to 1000.		
Room 5 Ms Cavey	Interpersonal Speaking: We are learning to convey information, competently and confidently about a person, place, thing or issue. Number strategies being developed: solve multiplication problems using repeated addition Use ten times facts to work out nine times facts Use times five facts to work out six, seven, and four times facts		
Room 6 Miss Gray	We will know we have been successful when we: -Know who we are writing to (Hunterville School students) -Why we are writing it (entertain, inform, persuade) -Have a clear topic in mind -Use personal voice (eg not our teacher/parents or Google's voice) -Have our ideas organised in paragraphs -Use interesting vocabulary -Use different sentences		
Room 7 Mr Smith	Reading – we are learning to read for information and answer a number of questions from our journal contracts. Writing – we are learning to plan, research and write a three minute speech.		
Room 8 Mrs Dalley	English – working on spelling strategies using root words, suffixes & prefixes. Maths – using bar diagrams for working out fraction & ratio problems.

Please note the following...

- 1. A grade will play a straight round Robin. The 2 teams with the highest points at the end of the round robin will play off in the A Grade final.
- 2. Grades B &C will play a round robin in their sections. At the end of section play finals will be played between the winner of sec 1 and the winner of sec 2.
- 3. D Grade will play a straight round robin. The tournament winner will be decided by highest points at the end of their round robin play. No Finals. (Goals will NOT be lowered today)
- 4. Each team will need to provide their own umpire who will umpire their team's games. RNC will allocate umpires for the finals.
- 5. All round robin and section games will be 8 minutes each way with a 1 minute half-time and 1 minute between games. Please make sure your teams have tossed and are ready to take the court immediately after the bell rings. Finals will be 2 x 10 minute halves.
- 6. There will be no extra time added for injuries. Please have your replacement players ready to take the court immediately should they be required.
- 7. Round Robin and Section play points will be awarded as follows...
 - WIN = 3 DRAW = 2 LOSS of 3 or LESS = 1 LOSS of 4 or MORE = 0
- 8. In the event of a tie at the end of round robin or section play the winner or finalists will be decided by Goal Ratio.
- 9. In the event of a tie in a final, play will continue until one team is ahead by 2 goals.
